Your reward for recycling is FREE tumbled glass and shredded wood mulch.

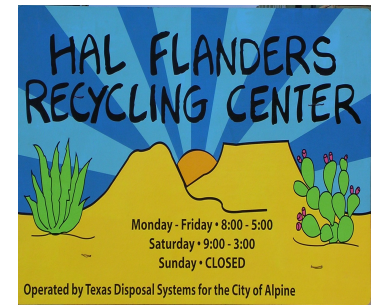

## ▶ Alpine Recycles! working for you

The glass brought to the Hal Flanders Recycling Center is processed on-site into a small smooth aggregate that can be used in landscaping, art projects,

construction, and more! All you need is a sturdy container (like a 5 gallon bucket) and a shovel, and you can have all you can haul! Great examples of how tumbled glass can be used are all over town....at the Cemetery, the Methodist Church, the Prescription Shop, and various residences. For safety reasons, the glass is in a secured area, so calling (432) 294-3183 before you plan to pick up is recommended to make sure someone is available to unlock the gate. Using glass that used to be a bottle or jar is a great way to REDUCE, REUSE, and RECYCLE!

### But wait, there's more!

Alpine Recycles! takes tree branches, trimmings, prunings from shrubs, and other yard waste and puts it through a chipper to produce shredded wood mulch. Mulch is a great boon to any garden to conserve moisture, suppress weeds, prevent soil erosion, and add nutrients back into the soil as it breaks down. No landscape should be without it!

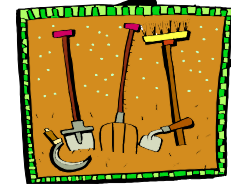


*Alpine Recycles! Chipper/Shredder*

### More on mulch....

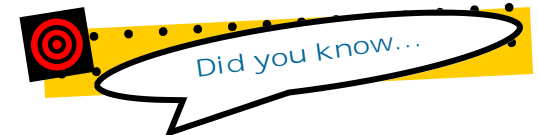
In addition to being good for your plants and soil, mulch can be used for paths through the garden, in the kids play area, under the clothesline, in animal pens, and as a groundcover for dust control. Why live with bare dirt when you can have a soft layer of wood mulch instead?

Both the tumbled glass and shredded mulch are self-service, so plan ahead:



*Bring tools and a sturdy container!*

- Bring sturdy containers
- Have a shovel for the glass
- A garden fork or rake works best for the shredded mulch
- Wear leather gloves
- Bring a helper (the glass is heavy)
- Make sure someone is available to open the secured area
